# COURSE DESCRIPTION AND OBJECTIVES

American Art History (1600-1875)--This course is designed to cover American art history from the birth of the United States through the Civil War. We will be exploring Native American art, mixed mediums of folk art, American architecture, and different schools of art through discussion and projects that will lead to a deeper level of understanding and appreciation of the artistic technique itself, historical context, and Biblical themes. Students will develop their own artistic skills through various mediums and projects, with peer critique being an integral part.

#### 1<sup>st</sup> - 2<sup>nd</sup> Class: Native American Art

- · Mixed medium
- Project choices =
  - jewelry (plastic beading)
  - o ceremonial mask (colored paper, markers, colored pencils, crayons)
  - o totem pole (recyclables, colored paper, markers, pipe cleaners, hot glue gun)

## 3<sup>rd</sup> - 4<sup>th</sup> Class: Colonial Folk Art

- Fabric arts
- Project choices =
  - embroidery (fabric, embroidery floss, needles, scissors)
  - quilting (fabric scraps, thread, needles, scissors)

# 5<sup>th</sup> - 6<sup>th</sup> Class: Early American Architecture

- Drawing
- Project choices =
  - architectural floor plans (rulers, pencil / pen, graph paper)
  - building concept drawing using 2 pt. perspective (white paper, pencil / pen, colored pencils)

## 7<sup>th</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> Class: Hudson River School (1826-70)

- Watercolor
- Project = watercolor landscape (watercolor paper, brushes, watercolors)
